The Construction (Design & Management) Regulations 1994 place duties on clients, planning supervisors, designers and contractors in particular to plan, co-ordinate and manage health and safety throughout all stages of the construction project.

This one day course is aimed at managers and supervisors who need to know and understand the implications of the CDM Regulations. The course will cover in details the requirements of the CDM Regs and relevant sections of legislation such as the Health & Safety at Work Act.
